In reality, it is recognised that huge opportunities stem from sharing PHI online, particularly in terms of the potential to improve overall health outcomes by harnessing the power of 'the crowd'. It essential that in realising these benefits we consider the broader implications around safeguarding the digital health personas of our citizens. The role of digital technology in driving forward the use of PHI cannot be underestimated.
